

DEATH ROLL OF THE COAL REGION.

POTTSVILLE, Penn., Jan. 21.—The collieries in the Pottsville, Shenandoah, and Shamokin districts worked an average of 23 days during December. In preparing for market 1,011,000 tons 27 miners were killed and 7 seriously injured. The reports of the inspectors for last year, just published, show that in the same districts during 1885 116 persons were killed and 819 injured. Fifty-nine wives were made widows and 191 children fatherless.
